President's Message

The Hopeful Ways Mission in Nicaragua continues to be vibrant and active. The February 2018 mission trip was highly successful and helped thousands of Nicaraguans by improving or restoring their vision. Unfortunately, the government's response to demonstrations has restricted movement within the country and slowed Hopeful Ways activities during the second half of 2018. While a new "normal" social environment exists within Nicaragua, the country is still not safe for our volunteers to travel there in 2019. However, this new "normal" is allowing Hopeful Ways in-country partners to continue providing services to the poor with our support. Advance planning by the Hopeful Ways leadership has put supplies and relationships in place that will keep the mission moving forward during 2019.

The Nicaragua Lions Clubs are planning weekend eye clinics to distribute eyeglasses and organize cataract screenings. FONIPRECE, the Hopeful Ways non-profit eye surgery partner, has been conducting cataract screenings and already has 53 patients on the cataract eye surgery waiting list. With funding and supplies provided by Hopeful Ways, FONIPRECE surgeries will soon begin the task of restoring sight to these people. Hopeful Ways intends to exceed 100 eye surgeries during 2019. Fortunately, the 2018 fall fundraisers were very successful thanks to the generosity of Hopeful Ways supporters resulting in sufficient funds to support these efforts.

While this is all good news, there is no time to relax. There is still much work required to coordinate the activities with the Hopeful Ways partners in Nicaragua. Also, additional fundraisers must be planned during 2019 so that this mission can continue through 2020 and beyond.

Many more poor Nicaraguans still need help and have nowhere else to turn. In reality, this need has increased due to the financial decline of the economy due to the political climate. The Nicaraguan people appreciate the generosity of the Hopeful Ways supporters and the efforts of the Hopeful Ways volunteers. Thank you all!!!

Hopeful Ways completed 3 successful fundraisers during Fall 2018 to generate funds that will restore eyesight to nearly blind people through severe cataracts.

In September, Hopeful Ways volunteer Jim Carlins bicycled **360 miles** on the Erie Canal Trail from Albany to Buffalo to highlight the plight of poor needing cataract surgery. Many thanks to all the supporters who donated during this successful event.

Sight Restoring Cataract Surgery Expands during 2019

Hopeful Ways partners with the non-profit eye surgery clinic FONIPRECE and Nicaragua Lions Clubs to restore eyesight to people who are nearly blind due to severe cataracts. Cataract surgery is a common procedure in the USA, but not accessible to the Nicaraguan poor. **Severe cataracts are the leading cause of curable blindness** in developing nations around the world.

Hopeful Ways intends to expand delivery of cataract surgeries to over 100 poor people during 2019. FONIPRECE and the Lions Clubs have already begun cataract screenings to locate potential patients and 53 people have been identified. Scheduling for surgeries will begin in the near future.

Many thanks to the dedicated volunteers at Hopeful Ways, FONIPRECE and the Lions Nicaragua Clubs, as well as the generosity of Hopeful Ways supporters and District 20-N Lions Clubs for making this program a reality. Restoring eyesight is a tremendous gift that is immensely appreciated by the Nicaraguan people.



Rivas Lions Conduct Eye Care Clinic

On February 23rd, 15 members of the Rivas Decano Lions Club traveled to Ometepe Island and conducted an eye care clinic for the people in the communities of Altagracia and Mogogalpa.

500 low income people received eyeglasses. This not only significantly improves the daily lives, but allows many of them to continue jobs that require detailed work like sewing and leather crafts. **This eye care clinic was made possible by the eyeglass collection donated by Hopeful Ways to the Rivas Lions Club.**



Dorlan Studies Medicine in Canada

Dorlan has volunteered with Hopeful Ways as a language interpreter since 2013. In 2017 he started medical school in Managua and was awarded a semester scholarship to study medicine at University of Calgary in Canada. What a terrific opportunity for him to learn and associate with high quality Canadian instructors. Unfortunately, the cost of airfare was a significant obstacle for him accepting this award. This obstacle grew larger after the political unrest began and the US government did not allow Nicaraguan citizens to fly through US airports, which more than doubled the cost for Dorlan's airfare.

Part of Hopeful Ways' mission includes providing educational opportunities to those in need. Over the years, Dorlan has worked diligently as a Hopeful Ways volunteer and as a student to earn this educational opportunity. Especially with the disruption of classes at the University of Managua due to the political unrest, Hopeful Ways did not want Dorlan to miss this opportunity. Hopeful Ways purchased Dorlan's roundtrip airline ticket, and Hopeful Ways volunteers met Dorlan in Canada to deliver winter clothes, jackets, hats and gloves. The winter months were a new experience for Dorlan and his Nicaraguan wardrobe was not suitable for the climate. While Dorlan loved the beautiful Canadian landscapes, he much prefers the warmth of the Nicaraguan sun versus the bone chilling temperatures in Calgary.

Dorlan returned to Nicaragua at the end of December after a wonderful experience at the University of Calgary. He will take these educational experiences with him as he continues his studies at University of Managua. Dorlan's medical expertise and his giving nature will make him a valuable asset to the Nicaraguan community for many years to come.



Nicaragua Friends in Costa Rica

The political unrest in Nicaragua has been socially, educationally and economically disruptive for the country. Some of the Nicaraguan Hopeful Ways volunteers have opted to leave their homes for opportunities and safety in Costa Rica. During a recent trip to Costa Rica, Jim and Loretta Carlins took the opportunity to visit one of their longtime Nicaraguan friends, who has volunteered continuously as an interpreter for Hopeful Ways since 2012.
